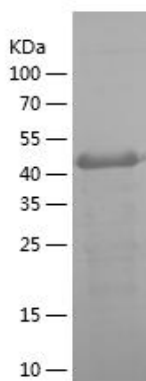


## Recombinant Human CA9

<b>Formulation:</b>	Lyophilized from a 0.2 $\mu$ m filtered solution in 10 mM Hepes, 500 mM NaCl with 5% trehalose, pH7.4
<b>Reconstitution:</b>	Centrifuge the vial prior to opening, reconstitute in sterile distilled water or buffer of interest to a concentration of 0.1-1mg/ml by gently pipetting 2-3 times, don't vortex.
<b>Storage:</b>	The lyophilized protein is stable at -20°C for up to 1 year, the protein solution can be stored at 2-8°C for up to 1 week. For extended storage, it is recommended to further dilute in a buffer containing 0.1% BSA (make sure BSA will NOT interfere with your experiment ) and store in working aliquots at -20°C to -80°C for 6 months. Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycle.
